PROVISIONAL SUSPENSION ORDER AND MINUTE OF TELEPHONE CONFERENCE DATED 4 MAY 2020

- Simeon Woolsey is a member of MotorSport New Zealand, and his sport has adopted the 2020 Sports Anti-Doping Rules (SADR) promulgated by Drug Free Sport New Zealand (DFSNZ) as its anti-doping policy.
- 2. On 29 April 2020, DFSNZ filed an Application for the Provisional Suspension of Mr Woolsey. DFSNZ confirmed service on Mr Woolsey that same day.
- 3. A telephone conference was convened by the Tribunal Chairman on 4 May 2020 in respect of the Provisional Suspension Application. Mr Woolsey advised that he did not oppose the application.
- 4. Accordingly, and being satisfied that there was no substantive reason why provisional suspension should not be imposed, the Tribunal Chairman ordered the provisional suspension of Mr Woolsey with immediate effect from 4 May 2020. Mr Woolsey may not take part in any way in any event or activity, organised, sanctioned or authorised by MotorSport New Zealand or by any other sporting organisation which is a signatory to the SADR.
- 5. It appears that the breach will be admitted and there will only be submissions on sanction. The parties hope they may be able to reach a common position which they can present to the Tribunal.
- 6. The following timetable orders were made in relation to the substantive anti-doping rule violation proceedings:
 - (a) The Respondent is to file and serve his Form 2 together with any evidence and other written material in support by **Friday 15 May 2020**;
 - (b) DFSNZ is to file its' response by Friday 22 May 2020;
 - (c) A further teleconference is set for 9am Monday 25 May 2020.

7. A copy of this Provisional Suspension Order and Minute will be sent to the parties but otherwise should remain confidential until publication of the final decision on the Anti-Doping Rule Violations. All other process steps under the SADR should similarly remain confidential.
