**ORDER STRIKING OUT** 

Dated 9<sup>th</sup> day of November 2007

1. In a minute dated 18 October 2007, I advised that, in my view, the Tribunal does

not have jurisdiction to hear this appeal. Mr Williams was given seven days to

advise whether he intended to proceed with the appeal.

2. An email has been received from Mr Williams advising that, after discussions with

his lawyer "it appears that continuing is unlikely to be viable unless Triathlon New

Zealand agrees for the Sports Disputes Tribunal to hear the case". He indicated he is working through SPARC to discuss resolution to try and make this happen.

3. I take it from the email that Mr Williams accepts that this Tribunal does not have

jurisdiction to hear the appeal. This is clearly my view and it is pointless to

convene a hearing to argue a matter which would lead to an inevitable striking out.

4. If Triathlon NZ agrees to have the matter resolved by the Tribunal, it is not as part

of the appeal process. It will come within another provision of the Tribunal Rules.

In these circumstances, the appeal will be struck out.

**ORDER** 

5. The appeal by Mr Williams is struck out.
